Today we remember the work of the Cystic Fibrosis Trust (Surrey Branch) whom we support with our outward giving. The Cystic Fibrosis Trust is the UK's only national charity dedicated to all aspects of CF, one of the UK's most common life-threatening inherited diseases. Disability Challengers - Disability Challengers, based at Stoke Park, is dedicated to enhancing the lives of disabled children and young people by providing essential play and leisure activities. Set up in 1979, it operates its own play centre for children aged 4-12 and also uses the community centres at Bellfields and Stoughton to provide activities for disabled young people up to the age of 25. A play and youth centre at Farnham opened in 2008 and they also manage community projects across Surrey.
