The Lewis Carroll Society is holding their annual meeting in Guildford, from July 15th – 18th. On Sunday 18th they will be attending matins in St. Mary's, where Charles Dodgson (Lewis Carroll) preached several times. They have asked Mary Alexander to give them a talk before the service, at 10.30, on Lewis Carroll and St. Mary's. The talk will include Dodgson's attitude to religion, the religious movements of the time, parish life between 1868 and 1898, and what Holy Trinity choir sang in 1877! Everyone is welcome.

Sadly the price has gone up...' the recession' you might say, but that's not quite it. The harvest was much smaller last year so the income from a smaller crop is still needed to provide the farmers and their families with money to survive. So why was the harvest smaller? The weather? Yes, but then the farmers were hindered by the Israeli authorities from tending the remaining crops. When they could get to the olive trees they were then intimidated by Israeli settlers.....so harvesting the crop has not been easy.
